MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Council President Ford opened the floor to the public for discussion on any topic.

<u>Janice Trama 900 Maple Avenue, Linwood</u> – Ms. Trama indicated that drivers are not stopping at the new stop sign on Maple Avenue and she fears someone will get hurt.

<u>Tim Votta 901 Maple Avenue, Linwood</u> – Mr. Votta emailed his opinion on Ordinance No. 1 2024 (Attached as Exhibit B). His principle concern is the lack of available street parking in his area and the further strain the Ordinance would create. He suggested extending the one-way traffic pattern from Shore Road as a possible solution.

Seeing and hearing no other members from the public wishing to be heard, Council President Ford closed the floor.

FINAL REMARKS BY MAYOR AND COUNCIL

<u>Mayor Matik</u> – The Mayor advised that after receiving the email from Mr. Votta, he drove around the area to look at it again. The Ordinance was pulled for more time to consider a possible solution.

<u>Councilwoman DeDomenicis</u> – Councilwoman DeDomenicis wished everyone a Happy Valentine's Day and a safe President's Day weekend.

<u>Councilwoman Albright</u> – Councilwoman Albright thanked the public for their comments. The Chief of Police is here to listen to the comments regarding drivers not stopping at the stop sign and she is sure he will look into that. With the building of the new homes on Maple and around the City, we have new issues. Council will re-visit the Ordinance after more consideration. She wished everyone Happy Valentine's Day.

<u>Councilman Walcoff</u> – Councilman Walcoff appreciates Mr. Votta's email. This process allowed Council to look at the situation again. They will come up with a solution.

<u>Councilman Michael</u> – Councilman Michael thanked everyone for their comments. He advised that the Chief of Police will look into the vehicles not stopping at the stop sign. He wished everyone a Happy Valentine's Day and a safe President's Day weekend.

<u>Councilman Levinson</u> – Councilman Levinson wished everyone a Happy Valentine's Day. He appreciates the public providing their comments. He understands there are issues and Council members will sit down and review the situation

<u>Councilman Kelly</u> – Councilman Kelly attended a Library Board meeting last week. There are a lot of good things happening there. He will be attending the Recreation Board meeting next week. He is motivated to participate on Council. He thanked Mr. Votta for his email noting how nicely written it was and that this is an indication of how the process works.

FINAL REMARKS BY MAYOR AND COUNCIL (continued)

<u>Council President Ford</u> – Council President Ford indicated that there is a great group on City Council. They are individually looking at the intersection. Council added two new stop signs on Maple Avenue and will look into this further. It is a great discussion and Councilwoman Albright's committee will come up with a solution.
