The City Clerk read Resolution No. 111, 2023 by title only. A Resolution supporting an amendment to Senate Bill #3049 to require all State Police cases and cases from State Agencies along with cases from any non-municipal Law Enforcement Agency which originate from municipalities that do not participate in the Central Municipal Court in Atlantic County to remain with and to be adjudicated in the court to which the non-participating municipality belongs. Councilman Walcoff motioned, seconded by Councilwoman Albright to approve Resolution No. 111. All members of Council were in favor. Motion was approved.

APPROVAL OF BILL LIST: \$1,309,594.29

Councilwoman DeDomenicis motioned, seconded by Councilwoman Albright, to approve the bills for payment. A roll call vote was heard with seven in the affirmative. Motion was approved. (The bill list is attached as Exhibit A)

Councilwoman DeDomenicis opened the floor to the public for discussion on any topic. Seeing and hearing no members from the public wishing to be heard, Councilwoman DeDomenicis closed the floor.

<u>Councilman Michael</u> – Councilman Michael discussed how last year the Special Class III Officers were added to the Linwood Schools and how great it has been having them work there. The Officers have developed great relationships with the staff and students and have even participated in playing instruments and ice bucket challenges. They are doing a fantastic job.

<u>Councilwoman Byrnes</u> – Councilwoman Byrnes announced that the playground at the Library is finally being installed and should be completed by next week. She thanked everyone for their support with the playground. She announced that today is Flag Day and wished everyone a Happy Father's Day.

<u>Councilman Levinson</u> – Councilman Levinson congratulated the lacrosse teams. He also thanked Mrs. Napoli for all her efforts with the Municipal Joint Insurance Fund.

<u>Councilwoman Albright</u> – Councilwoman Albright announced that the New Jersey American Water Company will be doing work in the City and there will be detours. She reported that automated openers were recently installed on all the doors at the Library. She, too, commends the work the Class III Officers are doing in the schools and congratulated the lacrosse teams.

<u>Councilman Walcoff</u> – Councilman Walcoff is very proud of the lacrosse teams and its program. He announced that schools are out for the summer and reminded everyone to drive safe.

<u>Council President Ford</u> – Council President Ford congratulated the lacrosse teams, noting they have a great program. He discussed how Council works together as a team. The members sit on several committees that each have a Chair. The committees do amazing work in due diligence and discussing all issues. He congratulated the Mainland and Belhaven graduates.
