<u>Councilman Kelly</u> – Councilman Kelly agreed that the parade was a great event. He thanked Public Works for helping to clean up. He also commended Councilwoman Albright, Councilman Walcoff, and Council President Ford for an impressive Master Plan. He seconded the comments from the Mayor on the Mainland Board of Education raising taxes.

<u>Councilwoman Albright</u> – Councilwoman Albright thanked the public for their comments. She thanked the Police for doing a good job with the detours throughout the City with all the road work going on.

<u>Councilwoman DeDomenicis</u> – Councilwoman DeDomenicis also commended the Planning, Engineering, and Development Committee on the master plan.

<u>Councilman Levinson</u> – Councilman Levinson thanked everyone for attending. He knows the plan took a lot of time and effort. He understands the residents concerns. He congratulated the Belhaven Band.

<u>Council President Ford</u> – Council President Ford thanked the public for attending.
